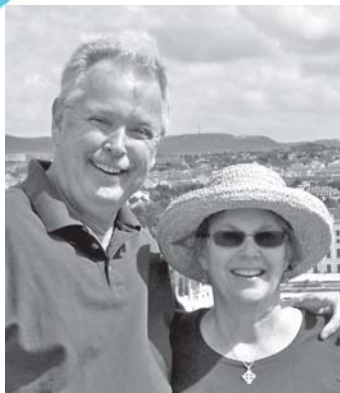

YOUR DAY BY DAY ITINERARY

THU, APR 26 – DEPART NEW YORK

Your exciting adventure begins as you depart the United States on board your overnight transatlantic jet flight to Barcelona.

FRI, APR 27 – ARRIVE BARCELONA

Today you arrive in cosmopolitan Barcelona, Spain, the cultural and political center of Catalonia and Spain's most European city. The city is divided into two sections: The Gothic Quarter symbolizes the older part and its wide avenues distinguish the more modern section. Upon arrival, enjoy a tour of the city. Highlights include the Gothic Quarter, the world famous Cathedral and the Holy Family Church, "La Sagrada Familia" by Gaudi.

SAT, APR 28 – BARCELONA/EMBARK SHIP

Today you transfer to the pier for embarkation on the luxurious NORWEGIAN SPIRIT. NCL's ship shines from bow to stern with an incredible array of amenities including many distinct restaurants, numerous bars and lounges, swimming pools, spa and more. (B,D)

SUN, APR 29 – PROVENCE (TOULON)

Located in the Provence-Alpes-Cote d'Azur region in southern France, Toulon is the capital of the Var department in the former province of Provence. Here you can walk around this charming town adorned with small squares, fountains, quaint shops and cafes. (B,L,D)

MON, APR 30 – LIVORNO (FLORENCE)

Arrive this morning in Livorno, the gateway to Pisa, famous for its "Leaning Tower", and Florence, the cradle of Renaissance Art and former stronghold of the infamous Medici family. From Botticelli to Da Vinci, Florence is unsurpassed in art treasures and the glory of its history. Opportunity to take a tour of the city or visit the Academia to see Michelangelo's original statue of David. (B,L,D)

TUE, MAY 1 – CIVITAVECCHIA (ROME)

From the port of Civitavecchia you have the chance to visit Rome and Vatican City. On optional sightseeing tours you can see the wonderful art treasures in the Vatican Museum and Gallery and Raphael's Rooms. View Michelangelo's exquisite frescoes in the Sistine Chapel, including the famous Last Judgment and The Creation of Man, and visit St. Peter's Basilica. Other popular sights include the romantic Trevi Fountain and the Colosseum, where Christians were once thrown to the lions. (B,L,D)

WED, MAY 2 – NAPLES

Today you arrive in Naples where you can visit Pompeii, a city destroyed by the eruption of Mt. Vesuvius in the year 70 A.D., the isle of Capri or drive along the magnificent Amalfi Coast with its spectacular views of the Mediterranean to the cliff-top town of Sorrento. (B,L,D)

THU, MAY 3 – AT SEA

What a great opportunity today to explore all the *NORWEGIAN SPIRIT* has to offer - where, from sunrise to sunset the decks and public rooms abound with an endless variety of activities. (B,L,D)

FRI, MAY 4 – MYKONOS

Arrive at Mykonos, a great favorite with its endless winding streets leading to scenic harbors or deserted sandy coves. This island is most famous for its white-washed windmills and 365 tiny churches with their brightly colored domes. (B,L,D)

SAT, MAY 5 – ISTANBUL

Today you arrive at Istanbul, ancient Constantinople. Here you may visit the Topkapi Palace, home of the Ottoman Sultans and see the Treasury containing jewel-encrusted thrones, the world's largest emerald and the famous Topkapi dagger. Chance to see St. Sophia, originally a Christian Basilica or visit the legendary Blue Mosque with six minarets and a middle dome of 109 feet. Be sure to stop at the Grand Bazaar, a labyrinth of over 4,000 shops displaying everything from souvenirs in copper and onyx to precious jewelry, antiques and Oriental carpets. (B,L,D)

SUN, MAY 6 – IZMIR (EPHESUS)

Arrive Izmir, an archaeologically-rich city dating back 5,000 years. From Izmir, you can take an optional sightseeing tour to the magnificent city of Ephesus where St. Paul lived and preached. Here you may walk the marble streets or see the fabled Temple of Artemis, another Wonder of the Ancient World, the Stadium and the Library of Celsus. (B,L,D)

MON, MAY 7 – ATHENS

Arrive in Piraeus this morning, the port for Athens. Take an optional sightseeing tour or spend the day independently exploring the "birthplace of democracy" including the Olympic Stadium, the Temple of Zeus, or the Parthenon with the Temple of Diana. Shop in the afternoon in the Plaka or stop at a sidewalk cafe to enjoy a Greek specialty. (B,L,D)

TUE, MAY 8 – AT SEA

Opportunity today to participate in your ship's numerous activities and amenities. Get a massage or take a fitness class...attend an art auction...unwind in one of the whirlpool spas or simply lounge on deck and soak in the wonderful passing scenery. (B,L,D)

WED, MAY 9 – VENICE

Arrive Venice this afternoon. Free time to explore this enchanting city and perhaps take a gondola ride or take advantage of the many amenities available to you on board the ship including any last minute duty-free shopping. (B,L,D)

GENERAL CONDITIONS

RESERVATIONS, DEPOSITS AND FINAL PAYMENT:

Reservations may be secured upon payment of a deposit of \$600 per person. No reservation is considered firm until deposit has been received. Your initial deposit payment shall be deemed to be an acceptance of all the terms of our General Conditions. Space is limited and offered on a first-come basis. Final payment is due at Nawas Travel 100 days prior to departure date.

Nawas accepts Visa, Mastercard and American Express for balance/final payments only. Credit cards are not accepted for deposits. The price of the tour already includes a built-in discount of 3% for payments made by cash or check. There is no discount on credit card sales. Credit cards will only be accepted prior to the final payment due date. Credit card charges cannot be accepted over the telephone. Tour members who want to use a credit card for final payment should contact Nawas at the time final payment is due for further information.

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS: A U.S.A. passport valid for at least 6 months after the return date of the trip is required to travel. It is the sole responsibility of the traveler to check their passport's expiration date. Non-U.S.A. citizens may require visas in addition to a valid passport. It is the sole responsibility of non-U.S.A. citizens (including green card holders) to ensure they have the required visas/travel documents for each country to be visited on their tour and for re-entry into the U.S.A. Visa fees (if any) are not included in the tour price.

THE TOUR PRICE INCLUDES:

AIR TRANSPORTATION: By any IATA/ARC air carrier or other scheduled jet carrier, in economy class, with flights and air routings at the discretion of the air carriers and Nawas and based on non-refundable bulk group fares. Cancellations made after air tickets have been issued are subject to full cancellation penalties as imposed by the airlines. We strongly recommend all tour members retain both their ticket receipts and boarding passes as copies of same cannot be provided. Airline tickets must bear your first, middle and last name as it appears on your passport. Nawas makes every effort to provide the lowest possible price on our group tours and therefore does not guarantee the most direct routing to/from your final destination. Nawas is not responsible if an airline cancels, reschedules or delays a flight for any reason. Nawas is not responsible for and will not provide any refund for portions of trips missed due to canceled, rescheduled or delayed flights by any carrier.

SURFACE TRANSPORTATION: By deluxe motorcoach.

CRUISE ACCOMMODATIONS: Cruise accommodations are based on two persons sharing a twin bedded cabin with two lower beds and private facilities. A large variety of superior staterooms are available at supplementary costs (see price information). A person taking a single cabin (subject to availability) must pay a supplement. The supplement for a single cabin is available upon request. Nawas cannot guarantee roommates.

HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS: Accommodations are at first class hotels based on two persons sharing a twin bedded room with private bath. Nawas cannot guarantee roommates. A person taking a single room (subject to availability) must pay a supplement. The supplement for single room is available upon request.

MEALS: All meals on board the cruiseship.

SIGHTSEEING: Shore excursions are not included. They must be registered for in advance and paid for at the ship's Shore Excursion Desk once on board. Shore excursions cannot be prepaid.

TRANSFERS: Assistance and transfers to/from airport/pier/hotels are included.

SERVICE CHARGES, TAXES AND PORTERAGE: Service charges and taxes normally included in bills, government taxes on hotel bills in effect on April 18, 2011, and porterage at hotels of one normal size suitcase (maximum weight 50 lbs.) are included in the tour price.

FLIGHT INSURANCE: Automatic one hundred thousand dollars flight insurance policy for each Nawas-ticketed passenger, subject to policy terms and limitations.

DEVIATIONS: All deviation requests from the group itinerary must be received at Nawas in writing no later than 100 days prior to departure. A \$100 non-refundable fee per person will be charged on all deviations in addition to any extra airfare that may be incurred. Air deviations are subject to availability and restrictions as imposed by the airlines.

BAGGAGE: Airlines may now charge baggage fees for checked luggage on international/domestic flights based on the policy of each carrier. The maximum number of pieces of luggage, the weight allowance and baggage dimensions may also vary by airline from the USA to overseas destinations and beyond. Many carriers require that checked luggage in economy class not exceed 50 lbs with a combined length, width and height of 62 inches. Regulations vary for business/first class passengers. Airline policies regarding baggage are subject to change at any time without prior notice. It is the responsibility of each passenger to check with their airline prior to departure for baggage information, regulations and compliance. Nawas is not responsible for additional fees imposed by air carriers regarding baggage. Due to space limitations on Nawas motorcoaches, Nawas can only allow one piece of luggage per person plus a carry-on bag with total dimensions of 45 inches which fits in the

overhead bin or underneath the seat in front of you. Wheeled carry-on bags are not permitted due to limited motorcoach capacity. Nawas Travel accepts no responsibility for loss or damage to the tour members' baggage or personal belongings at any time. Baggage insurance is recommended and is available upon written request.

TRAVELERS REQUIRING SPECIAL ASSISTANCE: Disabled travelers requiring special attention or care must advise NAWAS in writing at the time of reservation.
